

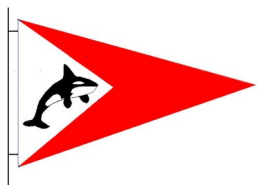
SAILWHATYOU GOTTA REGATTA

REGATTA RULES: As per the laws of the sea, skippers of their boats are responsible for themselves and their passengers. SWYC and SW Parks and Rec take no responsibility for boaters safety or any possible injury. Everyone in each boat must have a properly fitted life jacket and behave in a responsible manner on the water and while at the park.

Location: Lone Lake Park. Located off Andreason Rd at the end of Lone Lake Road.

Time: Noon to 5PM

Program : Pretty free form. Open boating will be available all day. Boats are welcome to and launch and retrieve throughout the day. The lake is big enough for everyone who wants to be out there. There will be a few scheduled events but that doesn't mean open sailing/boating is stopped. There is a Build a Boat activity for the very young and a few shore games and demonstrations will be ongoing.

Noon : SWYC Pelican skippers will offer free rides to anyone interested. Boats can handle two or three people in addition to the skipper. Everyone onboard must be able to swim and not be afraid of the water. PFD's are required, some will be available.

1 PM : Youth sailors from the Learn to Sail Program will race their El Toro's in a triangle followed by a smile and wave sailing past the park beach.

2 PM : Hotdogs become hot and available, condiments provided. Bring other stuff to make a picnic if you wish. Don't forget your water, some water will be available.

2 PM : Intermediate Youth sailors from the Learn to Sail Program race Vanguard's in a triangle followed by a smile and wave past the park beach. Other "fast boats" welcome to start too.

3 PM : Pelican Racing begins with rookie crews from the community. Other "slow boats" welcome to start too.

4 PM : All Boats parade past the beach
